VALUES

Authentic Fellowship

A church is a congregation of Christian believers, so unless there is a real sense of community, there is not a church. Christians are called to unity, sincerity, generosity, and hospitality. (1 Jn. 3:14, 4:11-13; Acts 4:32-36; Gal. 3:28; 1 Pet. 3:8)

Gospel Centeredness

In order to be faithful with God's Word, all teaching and preaching should be founded upon Scripture, not human wisdom. We should view all of reality in light of Jesus' death and resurrection. (1 Co. 2:13; Rom. 1:16)

Holistic Worship

All worship should be God-exalting, heart-felt, and theologically grounded. Regardless of musical style, we need to worship in both spirit and truth. As such, worship goes far beyond music and includes our entire lives. (Jn. 4:24; Rom. 12:1-2)

Compassionate Mission

The Church is called to reach the world and spread Christ's love. It is not enough to meet our own needs; we are called to help others. Our mission is holistic, not neglecting the physical or spiritual. (Mk 2:17; Mt. 25:40, 28:20; Jm. 1:27)

Celebrated Diversity

The Kingdom of God is multi-cultural, multi-generational, and multi-ethnic, not homogenous. It is essential that churches strive to resemble the Kingdom, always expanding. (Gal. 3:28; Jm. 2:1-13)

Believer Empowerment

As a priesthood of believers, everyone is called to ministry. Rather than restricting ministry to a few, the church should continually empower others, through the Holy Spirit, to serve in areas of need or giftedness. (1 Pet. 2:5,9; Rom. 1:5; 1 Cor. 1:12:7-11)

Loving Charismata

Because Scripture assumes that the Holy Spirit is still active, we should be welcoming to the Holy Spirit and spiritual gifts in our ministry, expressed within the guidelines provided in Scripture. Above all else, however, should be love and respect for others. (1 Cor. 12-14)

Inspired Creativity

Church is boring only when we make it boring. Our God is a creative God who made the universe, and we are called to reflect His glory with all of our being. (Gen. 1; Col. 1)
